In my Pocket, Great Aunty Bé, Thio Yianni

I wove three ghost-like images of 'handkerchiefs' embedded in a fine monofilament base cloth. During the weaving process I used supplementary threads in the warp and weft direction to create the handkerchiefs. The smallest piece includes a transfer print of an illustration from an iconic children's book from my country of birth ("Jip en Janneke").

The 'handkerchiefs' are memories of my youth, family and friends that I left behind when I immigrated to Australia.

At an emotional level they symbolise the deep sense of loss I still experience at times, despite a full and joyful life here in Australia.

After more than forty years, 'Longing' and 'Belonging' continue their dance in my life...

Everyone Everywhere (my woven Magna Carta)

The 'Magna Carta' (2015) is considered the first document to outline civil/human rights.

My woven Magna Carta depicts images of basic needs to be able to live a full life, including physical and cultural needs.

I translated drawings into a damask weave structure and wove these into a long, lace edged scroll on my Jacquard loom.

The heart and brain are woven in a different colour, to emphasise that the heart and mind are involved in all decisions.

Many people face displacement because their human rights are not met.
